

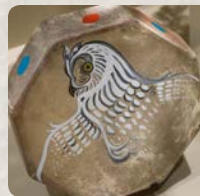
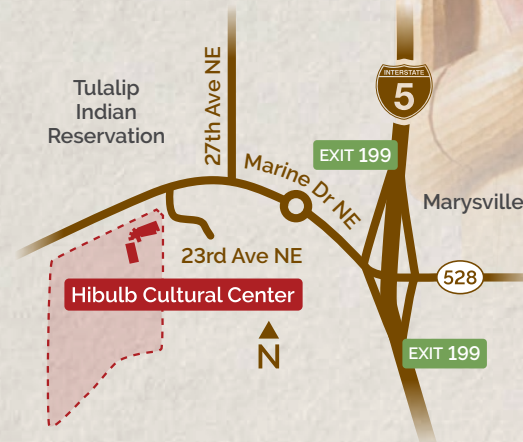

## WELCOME

The Hibulb Cultural Center is approximately 23,000 square feet with a 50-acre natural history preserve. Our interactive cultural center features a permanent gallery, a special gallery, two classrooms, a replica longhouse, a research library, and gift shop.

The Hibulb Cultural Center also features a fully certified collections and archaeological repository. We are the first tribal facility to be certified by the state of Washington.

### Permanent Gallery

Introduces the legacy of the Tulalip people by giving guests a historic perspective of the bands that make up the Tulalip Tribes.

### Special Gallery

Our rotating exhibit space where guests can view special items not permanently on exhibit organized by a particular topic.

### Longhouse Room

Experience a Tulalip longhouse by sitting and listening to a variety of recorded stories told by Tulalip's gifted storytellers.

### Research Library

The on-site library features books, media material, and Internet access to assist you in your research of Tulalip history and culture.

### Gift Shop

Features a variety of hand crafted Coast Salish items made by local artists. Here you can find unique jewelry, carvings, basketry, blankets, children's items, and much more.

### Programs and Events

Take part in Coast Salish culture by experiencing one of this month's events and programs. A schedule can be found online or displayed near the entrance. They include an array of demonstrations, workshops, cultural presentations, films, and lectures.

### Natural History Preserve

Our 50-acre site is filled with an abundance of natural features and habitats. Salmon-bearing streams, estuary wetlands, and patches of mature cedar, fir, and hemlock stands represent one part of the cultural legacy of the Tulalip Tribes.
